

KNOWLAGE OF POLISH LANGUAGE – Level A2

Level description: After the course students will be able to communicate in everyday situations with commonly-used expressions and elementary vocabulary, provide basic information about themselves, talk about their family and daily routine. They will be able to talk about their likes and dislikes, arrange meetings and welcome business visitors, provide information, make suggestions and express their opinion on various topics. Students will not be familiar with Polish verb conjugation types and basic cases (accusative, instrumental and genitive). They will be able to form sentences both in present and past tense
